As the province of Ontario enters stage 3 of reopening Conservation Sudbury will be reopening its office to the public, on an appointment basis only. To book an appointment, contact NDCA@ConservationSudbury.com, or call the staff member you have been dealing with. Face coverings are required within all areas of the building at 199 Larch St, including during meetings with Conservation Sudbury staff.

The Lake Laurentian Conservation Area has remained accessible to the public throughout as we understand the importance of access to nature for community health and well-being. Both the Nature Chalet and the BioSki Cottage remain closed although staff may be present from time to time. *The conservation area is accessible for passive, walk-through recreation only. Please follow posted signs and practice social distancing.* Lake Laurentian is accessible for paddlers or those wanting to come fishing from a non-motorized boat or shore. Dog owners are reminded to poop and scoop and keep all dogs leashed. Portable toilets are open and cleaned twice a day Monday through Friday. Parking at Lake Laurentian is limited. Please follow all the parking signs, in order to retain access for emergency vehicles. There is overflow parking at the end of South Bay Road.

Conservation Sudbury will monitor developments as well as provincial and local public health recommendations and reassess as needed.
